I have done my own research on this topic by calling National Committeemen in other states, and I want to share with you what I found out regarding First in the Nation status and the role of the National Committeeman at the state level.

First in the Nation (FITN)

Every National Committeeman I talked with said that Iowa's FITN status is not at risk. Here are the quotes and summaries of conversations on this topic:

- "The RNC will NOT oppose Trump."
